### Second Post-Election Ballot Count Update for the California Gubernatorial Recall Election

**LOS ANGELES** – The Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk (RR/CC) announced the second post-election ballot count update for the California Gubernatorial Recall Election.

The update includes **201,643** ballots processed since Election Night. The total election results count is now **2,701,111**, which is **47.47%** of registered voters. Election results can be viewed on [LAVote.net](#).

The estimated number of outstanding ballots to be processed is **412,940**. See estimates below:

- Vote by Mail ballots: 400,000
- Conditional Voter Registration ballots: 12,080
- Provisional ballots\*: 860

The estimated number of outstanding Vote by Mail ballots includes additional ballots received in the mail since Election Day. The estimate also includes ballots that are pending signature cures from voters whose signature on the Return Envelope was missing or did not match their registration record. These voters have been notified with instructions on how to cure their ballot.

Today is the last day the RR/CC accepted Vote by Mail ballots. These ballots are not included in the estimate. All outstanding ballots are verified before being tallied. These numbers will adjust throughout the [Official Election Canvass](#) as we receive, process, and tally ballots.
